Each room is complete with cutting-edge technology such as 3D printers, t-shirt makers, virtual reality simulators, and music production labs to encourage exploration, creativity, and learning in a state-of-the-art STEM environment. D-backs leadership and alumni joined City of Phoenix officials, Cox representatives, and over 150 Club kids and staff in honoring this monumental investment in the D-backs' namesake Club, nestled in the South Phoenix community.
